NOTABLE CHRISTIAN EVENTS CELEBRATED THIS WEEK

Ash Wednesday – 5th March

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a 40-day period of repentance, fasting, and reflection that leads up to Easter in the Christian tradition. On this day, many Christians attend church services where ashes—often made from the burned palm branches of the previous Palm Sunday—are applied to their foreheads in the



shape of a cross. This act symbolizes humility, mortality, and the need for forgiveness, serving as a reminder of the phrase, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return." It is a solemn occasion that sets the tone for the Lenten journey.

The origins of Ash Wednesday can be traced back to early Christian traditions of penance and fasting. By the 7th century, the Church formalized the practice of beginning Lent with a day of repentance. The ashes used in the ceremony symbolize humility and mortality, drawing inspiration from biblical references that associate ashes with mourning and repentance. Initially, public penitents began their period of penance on this day, often marked by ashes and sackcloth. Over time, the ritual extended to all believers, serving as a collective reminder of the need for reconciliation with God.

7th March - Perpetua, Felicity and Companions, 203



The moving, contemporary account of these early third-century African martyrs proved to be of great significance in the life of the early Church. Vibia Perpetua was a young, married noblewoman of Carthage and Felicity was her personal slave. Saturus was possibly a priest and there were two other men, Saturninus and Revocatus, the latter also a slave. Felicity was

pregnant. It seems most of them were catechumens when arrested and only baptised later in prison, where Perpetua had a vision in which she climbed a great ladder into paradise. They were condemned as Christians by the Roman authorities and dispatched to the public arena, there to be mauled by wild animals. They all survived and were then taken to be executed by the sword. Before this, they exchanged the Kiss of Peace and affirmed their faith in Christ, the Son of God. The account of their martyrdom was widely circulated in secret throughout the Christian congregations and proved both to give renown to their courage and to give encouragement to their fellow Christians in the face of adversity. They were martyred for their faith on this day in the year 203.
